I, WAYNE DAVID LUNT declare that this statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that if it is tendered in evidence at the Inquiry I will be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

1. The Inquiry has disclosed a number of documents to me. Where I make specific reference to a document in my statement I have given the number of the relevant page.
2. This is my first witness statement in connection with the death of Robert Hamill. I was arrested and interviewed by the police on 3 occasions during 10 May 1997 and the transcripts of the interviews conducted by the police are pages **6803** to **6927**. 10 years on I do not have a clear memory of 26/27 April 1997. For the purpose of this statement I have refreshed my memory from the interview transcriptions.
3. In April 1997 I was living in Portadown with my parents; we had recently moved house. I had lived in Portadown for all of my life at that time. I was 17 years of age and had recently started work as a labourer. I do not remember who I was working for, but I had been there for a month or 2 at that point.
4. I had lots of friends in those days, and usually we were quite close. It depended, but on a Saturday night I used to go out with [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] as he was called, Marc Burcombe, my brother, Philip, and a couple of girls. I did not know Davy Woods or Andrew "Fonzie" Allen, although I had heard of Fonzie.
5. On the evening of 26 April 1997 I think I met some girls in Brownstown Park, Portadown. The girls were Heidi Reaney, Lisa Hobson, Joanne Bradley and
